

****BASIC MENU WITHIN CATALYST****

For those of you with Catalyst, there is a feature that allows you to have a mini-menu beyond the main Catalyst menu to run your Basic programs (or similarly Pascal programs) without having to remember the pathname. To set it up see section 4 (Advanced Information) in the Catalyst 2.0 manual. This allows you to put your Basic programs on the hard disk and boot them from a menu also. To access this menu, your BASIC Startup Program on Catalyst should be as shown on page 4-1 of the Catalyst manual.

Access to the menu program should be automatic with the Startup Program configured as shown. If it isn't, go into basic and type RUN
.PROFILE/CATALYST/BMENU.EDIT and provide the proper pathnames for your basic program. You will need to have previously saved the programs to the hard disk and know their Program Path and Initial Prefix.

For example, if you have the program FOOTBAL stored on your Profile in a sub-directory call GAMES and FOOTBAL uses various data files in the sub-directory called SCORE, then your Program Path would be
".PROFILE/GAMES/FOOTBALL" and the Initial Prefix
would be ".PROFILE/SCORE"
